

# Internet Scavenger Hunt

This activity can be varied and used to teach students about business law.

## Corresponding Events:

Business Law

## Objectives:

- Identify different parts of law
- Teach students important court cases

## Materials:

- Computer with internet capabilities
- Pen/Pencil
- Paper

## Activity Time:

One hour

## Concepts Taught:

- Review of information from current section

## How to Play:

1. Separate students into groups of 1-3
2. Handout the list of questions for students to research
3. The goal is to find all the answers correctly in the fastest time possible
4. As students finish, write the time they complete all questions on the top of the page
5. When all groups are finished, grade all handouts and mark number correct on top
6. The group that gets all the answers correct in the shortest time wins (if no students get all the answers correct the team with the highest score in the shortest period wins)

## Options:

- Add bonus questions
- Adjust the questions each time to fit the current curriculum

## Assessments:

As the students work, walk around the room to make sure students are not cheating or working in teams outside their own. Students can have time added to their total for cheating.

The court found against him, saying he is still property and belong to his owner. This court case set a precedent at the time that didn't allow slaves to be free just because they escape to Free states.
