

# Human Safari Icebreaker

---

1. Each person writes down an interesting or unique fact about themselves on an index card. Do not put names on the cards!
2. The completed cards are collected and mixed together, then distributed so that each person gets a card with information about someone in the group.
3. Everyone then tries to find the person who matches the information on the card.
4. Use whatever time limit you want for people to search. It is not a requirement that everyone must find the person on their card.
5. When time is up, ask someone to introduce his/her person to the group by telling the name and the interesting fact about the person.
6. Then that person introduces the person he/she found, etc.
7. If someone did not find his/her person, they can share the interesting fact with the group and that person can introduce himself/herself to the group.

## Sample Processing Questions

- Was it difficult to think of an interesting fact about yourself?
- Why is that?
- Why is it important to learn facts about others?
- What efforts can we make to get to know people better outside of this group?
- What did you learn?
